Ranked Choice Voting is gaining in popularity and understanding. The League of Women Voters supports changing how we vote in local and state elections to Ranked Choice Voting. Why? Simply because it is a fairer way of representing the preferences of a majority of the voters in that jurisdiction.



Our president should be elected by the *people* — not the Electoral College.

The National Popular Vote Interstate Compact law will guarantee the Presidency to the candidate who receives the most popular votes in all 50 states and the District of Columbia. It will apply the one-person-one-vote principle to presidential elections, and make every vote equal.



Project 2025 outlined steps to restrict voting rights, The **SAVE Act** passed by the House is the beginning. The current administration is acting on Project 2025 ideals that would impact voting rights for the military, women, minorities and the physically disabled.
